

On Saturday SACS host Paul Roos in their annual Winter's Day derby fixture. The two schools have enjoyed a wonderful and illustrious rivalry over the years. Steeped in tradition both schools pay huge respect to the fixture and this weekend will be no different. SACS is proud to have been the school to have given their colours to UCT, while Paul Roos can boast a similar accolade in having given their maroon jerseys to the University of Stellenbosch.

The visitors are able to lay claim to having produced the most Springboks as a school in South Africa with a total of 51 since 1906. The most recent recipients of Springbok caps are Willie Le Roux, Juandre Kruger and Francious Hougaard. SACS has an equally impressive record with a total of 27 Springboks since 1906 with the most recent being the famed Percy Montgomery - who holds the points scoring record for the national side.

The visitors have held sway over the fixture in recent years and will be out to continue that record come Saturday. This SACS side, on the other hand, has proven that it can mix it with the best of them and shown great courage and character in all their fixtures thus far this season.
